By the end of FS2, a writer from Bickleigh Down C of E Primary School will:

- Write simply and coherently across a range of genres including stories and non-fiction texts.
- Use their phonic knowledge to write words in ways which match their spoken sounds. They also write some irregular common words.
- Write simple sentences which can be read by themselves and others.
- Spell some words correctly and others are phonetically plausible.
